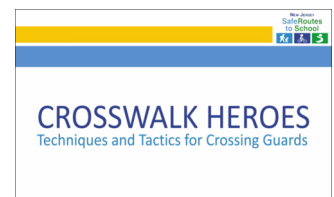

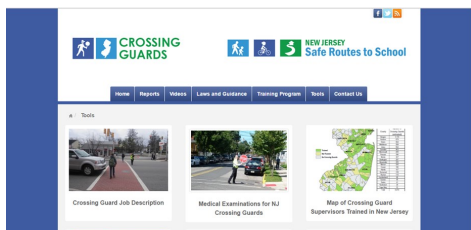

	Is crossing warning lights flashing (red/white and lights not stopped condition, defective, and sufficient)?		
	Is advance warning and flashing devices in a consistent with the MUTCD (2003) 2009 edition?		
	Is advance warning sign visible enough time for all to read? (Flashing required equipment present?)		
	Are crossing advance signs and advance warning signs in accordance with MUTCD 2009 edition?		
	Is there an adequate view of adjacent roadway, such as parking, trees, etc. (Is there a view of adjacent roadway with and without advance warning signs?)		
	Is advance warning sign posted in advance of crossing? (Advance warning crossing sign posted?) (Sign too close?)		
	Is sign too close?		
	Is sign too close adequate to allow guards and drivers to react safely?		
	Is sign too close or sign impaired?
